SALINA PUBLIC LIBRARY PARTNERSHIP

Salina Public Library and USD 305 are partnering to offer library cards to all students in the district. The School Library Card program gives students access to Salina Public Library's age appropriate books, digital resources, databases and other media. Students can check out up to 10 physical items at a time. There are no fines or fees, and free printing up to \$1 for school-related work when using the student card. Students can access learning resources such as Rosetta Stone, Creativebug, and the Learning Express Library. Students can use the database to research art, literature, genealogy, careers, history/government, and more. Many of the digital platforms are available in Spanish. ART

The Art Department at South Middle has been busy creating & learning this past semester. Sixth grade artists drew zoomed-in candy or food to practice observational drawing and created abstract notan designs. They learned to mix paint colors and created paintings showing depth or space. Seventh grade focused on drawing from observation and learning about Roy Lichtenstein, a Pop Artist. Students learned one point perspective and made a painting that included watercolor or acrylic techniques. Eighth grade focused on different art movements such as Cubism, Surrealism & Pop Art throughout their drawing, painting & ceramics projects. Within these art movements, students learned to create art using different methods & techniques.

Sixth & Seventh grade classes ended the semester with a ceramics project series based on their favorite holidays. They learned multiple methods of handbuilding with clay, such as creating texture and decoration, in order to make slabs and pinch pot mugs. Seventh & Eighth Grade classes created collaborative Tape Murals, inspired by muralists who covered up racist graffiti in urban downtown neighborhoods. Small student groups created the murals on lockers to send their own positive messages all around the school.

Curt Krob, a Salina Arts and Humanities Commission visiting artist, came to speak to students about his artworks, inspiration, techniques, and creative process. Curt really focuses on making art that is fun, witty, and showed our students what that can look like.

Finally, all of the art classes made handmade Holiday cards for Meals on Wheels to deliver with their holiday meals! Students focused on quality versus quantity and came up with some creatively layered holiday-themed cards. Students worked very hard to create 230 cards.
