## 6TH GRADE SCIENCE

Currently our Sixth Grade Science classes are studying the Earth's 6 major biomes. After researching and gathering informational facts, students will create a Super Hero that could survive in their Biome. With this project, they will remind us what type of animal and plant thrives in their biome using specific adaptions. They will also focus on the main threat to each of these regional areas.

After spring break, we will start to focus on Earth's Human Activity which will include alternative energies, natural disasters, and human impact.

We are really looking forward to Spring and Boys tennis! Mr Pittenger is entering his second season as Boys head Coach. Our Assistant Coach is the veteran with years of coaching and 5 years at South Middle as the Boys Assistant Coach. We are looking forward to a year of growth and are hopeful to continue building our program. While winning is fun, the goal is growth.


## 7TH GRADE SCIENCE

The 7th grade science department has some fun and exciting learning taking place. This quarter we are studying life science, more specifically about adaptations and relationships with animals and their environments. Part of this study is planning some activities that will emphasize how we interact with those environments. Part of the 7th grade Science experience is the dissection of frogs and the Trash to Treasures project in honor of Earth Day. The dissection of the frog is going to be happening during the 4th quarter. Many of the students are looking forward to this with excitement as well as some apprehension. It is guaranteed that the students will remember this for many years to come.

## 8TH GRADE SCIENCE

8th grade physical science classes will be coming back from Spring Break to finish our year out with 2 projects. Students will be using their knowledge of speed, acceleration and force to create a slow coaster. Groups will be competing against each other to design, build and test their creations. Students have the challenge of only using recycled paper and tape to build their coasters. The team that is able to keep their mechanism on their coaster the longest, without stopping, will be declared the winner.

Our last unit of the year will be over Newton's Laws of Motion. The unit will conclude with our egg drop activity. The students will have a budget and will be required to purchase their supplies from our classroom store. They will build a device that will protect their egg from cracking, doing so without going over their budget. For this project, the students will need to use their skills of gravity during a free fall, and ways to counter balance that force.
