As we move into November, we will begin girls basketball and wrestling competitions. SMS would like to thank all of our students and families that participated in our fall fundraiser. Wrestling

We are excited that the 2022 SMS Wrestling season is finally here! Our season opens up on November 1st with a meet at Lakewood. We are returning a strong core of eighth graders who will provide valuable experience and leadership to our team. We currently have 69 wrestlers on the team, including 19 girls. The majority of our team is first year wrestlers who are eager to learn a new sport. We hope to see you at our home meets on November 17th and December 6th.





6th Grade English

Sixth grade English classes are busy tackling parts of speech and different types of writing. Quarter one was spent working with nouns, pronouns, adjectives, and adverbs, as well as narrative writing. Students had the opportunity to write about a favorite childhood memory. Quarter two will focus on verbs, interjections, and using commas in a sentence. Students will wrap up the quarter writing an informative paper that coincides with articles from the sixth grade English and Reading textbook.



Technical Education

Students will learn to work with basic hand tools and some power tools in a safe and productive manner. Students will construct several small projects using different materials and processes. The projects constructed will go home with the students. Measuring skills will be taught, along with Basic Drafting. STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math) are a part of the curriculum, providing students exposure to real world problems and finding solutions to those problems. Student accountability and responsibility are stressed in the curriculum. This class is an elective choice for students in both 7th& 8th grades.

Winter Weather Ahead!

There may be days when the start of school is delayed because of weather. This option may be used if snowy roads could be cleared given a few hours or if wind chills are too low during early morning hours but temperatures are expected to warm up within a few hours.

The advantage of a delayed start is that we can minimize the loss of instruction while maintaining the safety of students and staff.

Whether a school cancellation or a delayed start is announced, the district will communicate as soon as possible using its rapid notification system. Notifications will be sent to families and staff via phone, email and text. (Parents and guardians are encouraged to update their contact information in Skyward.)

Details of a delayed start:

- **Bus routes**: General education and special education bus routes will proceed on a 2-hour delay.
- Pre-K: Morning classes will be cancelled. Afternoon classes will run as normal.
- **Foodservice**: Breakfast will not be served and there will not be a choice lunch option at elementary schools.
- Elementary Band/Strings: Band/strings at elementary schools will be cancel.
- **Heartland**: a.m. Pre-K will be cancelled. Breakfast will not be served.
- Salina Adult Education Center: All a.m. sessions and any GED testing scheduled for the day will be cancelled.

Changes to the school schedule are not taken lightly. While calling cancellation and delayed-start days creates inconveniences for families and impacts instruction time, upholding the safety of students and staff is our priority.

As always, the final decision about your students' safety is yours. If you choose to keep your student home when inclement weather occurs and school is in session, please contact the school attendance office and follow the procedures to report an absence.

7th grade English finished quarter one by writing a Personal Narrative Essay about a day they will never forget. For the first part of the second quarter, we are focusing on grammar components including prepositions, compound subjects and predicates, and types of sentences. We will also be writing an Explanatory Essay the first week of November. After Thanksgiving Break, we will begin reading, analyzing, and writing about the famous Charles Dickens story "A Christmas Carol." Finally, we will end the semester by comparing and contrasting this well-loved literature with its movie version. We are looking forward to a fun and festive time with lots of learning along the way!

8th Grade English

Our English curriculum, My Perspectives, provides opportunities to strengthen students' abilities in reading, writing, and using proper grammar and conventions. Our first unit of study focused on Rites of Passage. In this unit, students read and researched about important milestones on the path to growing up from different cultures and wrote nonfiction narratives about their own milestones. This quarter, they will be reading, analyzing, and discussing texts and poems that focus on what matters in life and when it is appropriate to take a stand. Students will write an argumentative essay that will involve making a claim and researching evidence to support that claim. Library Policies

Library Catalog Access for Families:

Parents have access to the library materials currently checked out by their student(s). For access, parents will have their student log into Destiny, the library card catalog:

- 1. Go to the school's website.
- 2. Under the Our School tab, click on Library.
- 3. Under Library, click on the school's library Card Catalog tab.
- 4. For your student to log in, they can click the Log In button on the top right corner.
- 5. Next, click on the Sign in with Google button.

Process for Parental Oversight:

Library media specialists should be contacted directly if parents would like to provide expressed permission before their student checks out any book. At elementary, the library media specialist will notify parent by email or phone regarding the book the student would like to check out to get permission. At middle school and high school, the student will provide their parent with the title of the book they wish to check out. The parent will contact the library media specialist by email or phone to give permission.

Checking Out Materials and Loan Periods:

Elementary:

Students may check out books for a two week period. (The number of books a student can checkout depends on the student's grade level.)

Middle School:

Students may check out 3 books for a three week checkout period.

High School:

Students may check out 8 books for a three week checkout period.

Proceso de Supervisión para los Padres:

Se debe contactar directamente a los especialistas en medios de la biblioteca si los padres desean dar permiso antes de que su estudiante saque cualquier libro. En la escuela primaria, el especialista en medios de la biblioteca notificará a los padres por correo electrónico o por teléfono sobre el libro que el estudiante desea sacar para obtener el permiso. En la escuela secundaria y preparatoria, el estudiante proporcionará a sus padres el título del libro que desea sacar. El padre se comunicará con el especialista en medios de la biblioteca por correo electrónico o por teléfono para dar permiso.

Verificación de Materiales y Períodos de Préstamo:

Primaria:

Los estudiantes pueden sacar libros por un período de dos semanas. (La cantidad de libros que un estudiante puede sacar depende del nivel de grado del estudiante).

Escuela Secundaria:

Los estudiantes pueden sacar 3 libros por un período de tres semanas.

Escuela Preparatoria:

Los estudiantes pueden sacar 8 libros por un período de tres semanas.

Puede haber días en que el inicio de clases se retrase debido al clima. Esta opción se puede usar si los caminos nevados se pueden despejar en unas pocas horas o temperatura del vientos demasiado bajo durante las primeras horas de la mañana, pero se espera que las temperaturas aumenten en unas pocas horas.

La ventaja de un inicio retrasado es que podemos minimizar la pérdida de instrucción mientras mantenemos la seguridad de los estudiantes y el personal.

Ya sea que se anuncie una cancelación de la escuela o un inicio retrasado, el distrito se comunicará lo antes posible mediante su sistema de notificación rápida. Se enviarán notificaciones a las familias y al personal por teléfono, correo electrónico y mensaje de texto. (Se alienta a los padres y tutores a actualizar su información de contacto en Skyward).

Detalles de un inicio retrasado:

- Rutas de autobús: Las rutas de autobús de educación general y educación especial procederán con un retraso de 2 horas.
- Pre-K: Se cancelarán las clases de la mañana. Las clases de la tarde se desarrollarán con normalidad.
- Servicio de alimentos: No se servirá desayuno y no habrá opción de elección de almuerzo en las escuelas primarias.
- Banda/Cuerdas de Primaria: La banda/cuerdas en las escuelas primarias se cancelará.
- Heartland: se cancelará el pre kínder de la mañana. No se servirá desayuno.
- Centro de Educación para Adultos de Salina: Se cancelarán todas las sesiones de la mañana y cualquier examen de GED programado para el día.

Los cambios en el horario escolar no se toman a la ligera. Mientras las llamadas de cancelación y los días de inicio retrasado crean inconvenientes para las familias y afectan el tiempo de instrucción, nuestra prioridad es mantener la seguridad de los estudiantes y el personal.

Como siempre, la decisión final sobre la seguridad de sus estudiantes es suya. Si elige mantener a su estudiante en casa cuando ocurre mal tiempo y la escuela está en sesión, comuníquese con la oficina de asistencia de la escuela y siga los procedimientos para reportar una ausencia.
