7th Grade Reading

7th Grade Reading students are starting second semester with a unit about persuasion and technology and will be creating a large project by the end of Quarter 3. Students will be encouraged to read William Allen White books. The William Allen White award is a statewide honor given to books that Kansas students read and cast their vote for. Students should read a minimum of 20 minutes a night to keep flexing their skills and to be able to vote in mid March. Quarter 4 is another class novel, *Refugee*, and will be returning to assigned reading and questions due every week. Vocabulary quizzes are still very important this semester and will happen every other week; please continue to support your student by studying the words often. A link to the vocab flashcards is available at the top of the Reading Classwork page in Google Classroom.



Intensive Reading - 7th and 8th Grade

The end of the semester is always a busy time for intensive reading teachers. We just completed BAS testing. This reading assessment tests a student's progress in their reading fluency skills and their comprehension skills. This semester, we have been working on phonics and comprehension skills with students to help each student make progress in their reading skills. This year we started a new phonics program based on students' instructional reading level, and are teaching various skills to help student's gain the confidence in learning how to decode harder words and also building their vocabulary, so they can begin reading and comprehending grade level text and also apply these skills in their social studies, science, and English classes.

Student's seem to like the new phonics program and are starting to see the benefits from what they are learning with the program. This is exciting as intensive reading teachers as we see students using the strategies being taught to help them make individual progress in their reading skills. As intensive reading teachers, we always try to find interesting articles and stories for students to read for comprehension. We would like to continue parents to encourage their child to read outside of school at least 15 minutes each day. They need to read a fiction or nonfiction book they enjoy. Have them share with you what they read about after they read. This is a way to encourage conversation between you and them. Go to the public library with your middle school student over Christmas break and check out a book with them. A book is a great way to escape, especially during the long, winter months.

Intensive Reading - 6th Grade

Over the past few weeks, students in 6th grade intensive reading class have been busy reading and learning about a wide variety of compelling topics. One particular topic that we focused on in class was a topic that is highly favored by many kids—video games. Not only did students get to learn about the benefits that come with playing "Roblox," but they also learned all about the up and coming competitive sport, "eSports." Another topic that students got the opportunity to read about in class were the different types of Christmas traditions that are exercised around the world. Many of the students were fascinated by the different ways that other countries celebrate the holiday season. Most recently, students have been reading about different styles of art. So far, students have read about a Spanish street art festival, as well as a British artist named, "Mr. Doodle."


